They require intensive support services in order to heal emotionally and physically to catch up educationally and to overcome obstacles facing their future. Support services for these children are essential, as they need special help in dealing with their emotions, deficiencies in school, social skills, behavior and independent living preparation. Here are some of the programs your donations fund:

The State provides the bare minimum of care (i.e. food, clothing and shelter). Sponsorship donations have gone for additional expenses like individual and group **Mental Health Counseling, Behavioral Step System** program, **Medical Services, Tutoring,** and **Children's extra-curricular activities.**

Special Olympics Florida-Palm Beach County provides year-round sports training and competition in a variety of Olympic-type sports for children and adults with intellectual disabilities who wish to participate, giving them continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy and participate in the sharing of gifts, skills, and friendship with their families, other Special Olympics athletes, and the community. The Young Athlete Program is a unique sport and play program for children ages 2 to 7 years with intellectual disabilities. The focus is on fun activities and games that are important to mental and physical growth.

Located in Boca Raton, Florida, George Snow Scholarship fund provides educational grants to some of the areas brightest and most deserving young scholars. These scholarships are four-year commitments and are designed to bridge the gap between other financial aid and what the scholar and their families can afford.

Since its inception the Fund has awarded over \$6 million dollars in educational grants. In the year 2013 alone, the Scholarship Fund awarded over \$580,000.00 in commitments to 80 students. This level of support places the Fund as one of Palm Beach County's largest sources of educational grants. The Fund aims to grant at least one award to each public high school in Palm Beach County.



The Unicorn Children's Foundation provides leadership, education, and resources to illuminate a new perspective of individuals with neurodiversity as uniquely talented and capable who can be productive and fulfilled members of society. In August 2013, the Foundation opened the doors to Unicorn Village Academy, an innovative high school in west Boca Raton that allows youth who think, communicate and learn differently to develop life-long personal, social, and career skills based on their own strengths, interests, and preferences.



For more than 40 years, Florence Fuller Child Development Centers (FFCDC) has provided affordable childcare, quality pre-school, enriched afterschool and summer camp to children from low income families. All of the parents are gainfully employed, pursuing further education, in job training or may be disabled. 625 children between the ages of one month to 13 years are currently being served at FFCDC's two Boca Raton locations.



The First Tee serves Broward, Palm Beach, Martin and St. Lucie Counties. They are a National youth development organization that teaches Nine Core Values and Nine Healthy Habits using golf as the method of delivery with many community partners including Boys and Girls Clubs, YMCAs, Big Brother Big Sisters and PAL. The majority of their Coaches are PGA or LPGA professionals trained by The First Tee. The First Tee has partnerships with 20 golf course or practice facilities in the four counties and operates their own 12-acre practice facility in Dyer Park in West Palm Beach. They are planning for extensive growth in the near future as there are over 200,000 elementary school students in our territory.

Place of Hope cares for 265 children and youth in our region on a daily basis through one of their five campuses or traditional foster homes. They provide a full continuum of care for children in foster care, pregnant teens, victims of domestic minor sex trafficking and those who have "aged-out" of care. Place of Hope at The Leighan and David Rinker Campus currently houses two programs for foster children and former foster youth with plans to add additional family style cottages, as well as expanding their transitional living program, Villages of Hope, for 18-25 year olds.



4Kids is propelled by the vision of a home for every child. Whether that is a child removed from their home for the first time, siblings who need to stay together, a young mom in an unplanned pregnancy who needs refuge, or a young adult who needs a place to belong. 4Kids is there with hope and homes.

## Holiday Toy Drive -
