Special Olympics provides year-round sports training and athletic competition for persons eight years of age and older with mental disabilities, giving them continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy, and participate in a sharing of gifts, skills, and friendship with their families, other Special Olympic athletes and the community.



SOS Children's Villages – Florida (SOS), makes it possible for abused, abandoned and severely neglected children to experience the meaning of home and family. In the village, children are assured caring parents, brothers and sisters, and a full and happy childhood.



The Unicorn Children's Foundation provides leadership, education and resources to illuminate a new perspective of individuals with neurodiversity as uniquely talented and capable who can be productive and fulfilled members of society.



For more than 40 years, Florence Fuller Child Development Centers (FFCDC) has provided affordable childcare, quality pre-school, enriched afterschool and summer camp to children from low income families.



Place of Hope cares for 265 children and youth in our region on a daily basis through one of their five campuses or traditional foster homes. They provide a full continuum of care for children in foster care, pregnant teens, victims of domestic minor sex trafficking and those who have “aged-out” of care. Place of Hope at The Leighan and David Rinker Campus (formerly Place of Hope at The Haven Campus) currently houses two programs for foster children and former foster youth with plans to add two additional family-style cottages, as well as the expansion of their transitional living program, Villages of Hope, for 18-25 year olds.
